## First Female Fields Medalist –

## Maryam Mirzakhani

Maryam Mirzakhani was an Iranian mathematician (born on May 12, 1977) and a mathematics professor at Stanford University. She earned a Ph.D. from Harvard in 2004. She was the first female mathematician to be awarded the very prestigious Fields Medal. In fact, the Fields Medal is the most prestigious award in mathematics, equivalent to a Nobel Prize (mathematics is specifically excluded from the Nobel prize). Awardees must be younger than 40 when they did the work for which they are receiving the award. Dr. Mirzakhani won the Fields Medal in 2014. Unfortunately she passed away in 2017 from breast cancer at the age of 40.
